- **Hunger and Malnutrition:** Limited access to nutritious food leads to stunted growth, poor health, and hindered educational achievement among children.

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## 3.0 Our Core Programs & Interventions

GWCFUG implements a holistic set of programs designed to address these multifaceted challenges.

### 3.1 Access to Education

Education is championed as the most powerful tool to break the cycle of poverty. The foundation runs campaigns to distribute scholastic materials and support girls in returning to and staying in school, directly confronting barriers like early marriage.

### 3.2 Economic Empowerment

This program provides vocational training (e.g., tailoring) and entrepreneurship support. It aims to lift families out of poverty by enabling women to gain financial independence and create sustainable livelihoods, thereby transforming them into community mentors.

### 3.3 Healthcare Support

To combat the struggle for medical access, GWCFUG establishes mobile clinics and provides antenatal care and health education. A key focus is on menstrual health education and distributing reusable sanitary pads to improve girls' school attendance and dignity.

### 3.4 Protection Against Violence

The foundation actively works to provide safety and advocacy for survivors of gender-based violence. It participates in global campaigns like the 16 Days of Activism to raise awareness and champion the rights of women and girls.

### 3.5 Nutrition and Hunger Relief

This initiative addresses critical malnutrition by working to improve access to nutritious food, combating its dire effects on child development and health.

### 3.6 Community Development

Underpinning all efforts is a commitment to building strong, self-sustaining communities. This holistic approach ensures that supportive environments are created where empowerment efforts can have lasting impact.

GWCFUG's methodology is grounded in direct action and community engagement, demonstrated by:

- Scale of Reach: Having served over 199 children across 10 districts in Uganda.
- Human-Centered Stories:
  - Supporting a 12-year-old girl to return to school after fleeing an early marriage.
  - Training women like Sarah in tailoring, who now supports her family and mentors other single mothers.
  - Conducting rescue missions and providing support for abandoned or abused street children in Kampala.

- Awareness and Advocacy: Hosting events like the Annual Women Empowerment Summit to discuss rights, entrepreneurship, and leadership.
